
Songfest and Campus Leadership Highlight Exciting Spring for Chapter

Both as individuals and a chapter as a whole, Ohio Iota continues to influence Toledo's campus in a variety of ways.

Coming off a strong fall recruitment class, Ohio Iota continued to focus on its year round recruitment goal by adding nine new members in the spring. These nine new members have proven to be an important addition to our fraternity, as they embody the same goals and aspirations that the rest of us hold.

With our chapter's Balanced Man Scholarship this past summer, Ohio Iota has been gearing up for an exciting fall recruitment.


I look forward to another exciting fall for our chapter as Ohio Iota continues to push for success in all aspects of collegiate life at Toledo.



The Career Achievement Award was presented in absencia to Gerald Seizert '75. The Distinguished Service




