He cared so deeply for his friends and family and influenced the lives of everyone around him.

Greg joined Sigma Phi Epsilon fraternity in the fall of 2008 and quickly took on many leadership roles within the chapter, including two executive board

positions, Songfest Director and Sigma Coordinator. Many younger members probably thought of Greg as a mentor, something of an encyclopedia of wisdom and life lessons despite his young age of 24. For those who were lucky enough to know Greg personally, he was caring, honest, funny, a hard worker, and a lover of life. Greg's true truth resided in his heart, constantly putting brothers before himself and the first to lend a helping hand.

There is a passage from the book called *The Little Prince* that states, "What moves me so deeply about this little prince sleeping here is his loyalty to a flower, the image of a rose shining through his whole being like the flame of a lamp, even when he is asleep." Although Greg is laid to rest, his legacy and selfless light will live on in the many lives he touched. He is finally footloose and free, no longer suffering in pain and his heart shining down on us all in heaven.

Richard "Dick" William Bensman, of Perrysburg, Ohio and Marco Island, Florida, passed away in Naples, Florida on Sunday, January 25, 2015. He was 84.

Dick was one of the inaugural members of Sigma Phi Epsilon Ohio Iota Chapter at the University of Toledo. Along with his classmates, Dick helped launch a grand legacy for SigEp that continues to thrive today. His passion for SigEp continued throughout his life even into his final years.

Dick was also an inaugural member of Blue Key National Honor Fraternity at the University of Toledo as it transitioned from its local ARX roots to a national organization. Blue Key has earned a proud and esteemed reputation as an Honor and Service organization limited to 13 undergraduate members at UT.

His long-time association and support of UT and the Sigma Phi Epsilon fraternity was a source of enormous pride, leading to the creation of the "Dick & Kay Bensman Scholarship for Sigma Phi

Larry Beer Given Career Achievement Award

Larry Beer, who pledged SigEp in 1973, will be honored at the annual Alumni Senior Dinner as this year's career achievement award recipient.

After graduating from UT in 1976 with a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology, Larry went on to obtain his Master of Arts in Counseling from Hofstra University in Hamstead, New York, and received his doctorate in Counseling Psychology from Western Michigan in 1986.

In 1989, Larry founded Child and Family Psychological Services, P.C., which today contains more than 40 licensed mental health practitioners in Kalamazoo and Portage, Michigan. Larry serves as President while maintaining an ongoing caseload focused on adolescents, adults, and couples. He also serves as Adjunct Assistant Professor instructing graduate-level academic courses at Western Michigan. Further, Larry is a training consultant for the Michigan Judicial Institute responsible for instructing probation officers and other court personal in basic counseling skills and other issues related to mental health.

In addition to his practice, Larry has a long list of volunteer activities. Most notably, Larry answered the call during some of our nation's most devastating disasters, serving as a Red Cross mental health volunteer during 911, and Hurricanes Andrew, Wilma, and Sandy.



Although the list of Larry's accomplishments are great, he stated that "balancing his career with family has been his proudest achievement." Larry and his wife Cindy will celebrate their 30th wedding anniversary this March by going on a two-week bike trip to Vietnam. They have three children Alyssa (27), Danielle (25) and Adam (21).

Alumni Board President's Message

One of the best sayings is "If you build it, they will come," from the 1989 movie, *Field of Dreams*.

Sigma Phi Epsilon started on September 30, 1950, at the University of Toledo. After many meetings, it came down to one vote ... Robert Gates, who, after many hours of decision making, chose SigEp over Sigma Alpha Epsilon. Now, this story can be told over and over by our first treasurer, Richard Springer, who is still preaching that he chose SAE over SigEp, and it is one of his worst decisions he ever made. SigEp has, over the last 65 years, gone through its ups and downs as most chapters do. Yet, if it were not for the courage of these men in 1950 to choose SigEp we most likely would not be in the position we are today.

Collectively, Chi Beta Chi and SigEp have made a huge statement on the University of Toledo Campus. The valleys and the mountains have been traversed by many, and you can testify that today, SigEp is climbing the biggest mountain at Toledo and not looking back. Why?

2000, a membership review, and the chapter nearly extinct, after winning Buchanan cups in 1983, 1985, 1987, and then a valley, SigEp surged again in 1995 to win our only cup of the decade. During this time, college fraternity life flourished, but again, the risks associated with this life increased with growing membership and few safety measures. By 1999, the chapter was literally out of control, and the future of SigEp became a question that even I could no longer stand and say ... *they will come* ... but they did. It all came down to a short meeting, in the restroom of a local establishment, where the University had decided SigEp was over at UT. With one last plea, a deal was made to let the chapter put on a presentation ... all 11 of them, to keep us on campus, and in our house. Let's just say, we won the battle, and never looked back.

Since 2000, this chapter has set standards that truly amaze me. Just to be a member, they chose to require nearly a 3.0 GPA to even join. Many of us would never have been able to join. With over 100 members today, it is hard to state that these young men were wrong. They have built a chapter of winners, men that care about our fraternity, its values, care for each other, trust, integrity, and

honesty. What a wonderful way to live life. But more than anything, the friendships we have made over the past 15 years have created a way of life, a value system that even those from 2000 cannot comprehend. When I think of where we

have come from, I am simply in awe that when the field was cleared, and the bases were planted, we grew this chapter that has standards and values far exceeding our own.

I must state, SigEp would never have been the same without the wisdom of our living founders, like Larry Leake, Dick Springer, Don Thurber, and Tom Schnell. All of these men have been the best guides for a great chapter. Also, for those that have gone before, and notably, Dick Bensman and Robert Gates, the friendships created will last my lifetime, and I for one cannot state how much men like them have meant to a chapter that has grown like it has over the past fifteen years.

Being a part of this game has been the most enjoyable ever over the past couple of years for me. We have an incredible alumni board, each of whom has a job, and does it well. We work well, from guys in their 50s to those in their 20s. In 2014 our membership honored us with the largest capital campaign that we have ever experienced. And we were able to help another brother in his time of need, and raised over \$14,000 for his cause. So, if you want to help, give us your time, your financial help, or both. We have built a grandstand around this chapter, and we want to build a stadium!

It truly is a great day for SigEp, and a great run! SigEp is up to bat again, and it will be out of the park in 2015!

At the University of Toledo, I am currently involved in the Student Wellness Awareness Team, Liftoff UT, and the Criminal Justice Society. I am extremely excited about serving the chapter this year and I am looking forward to building off of a record year in 2014.



2014 was an extremely successful year for Ohio Iota. We were able to win the Trifecta for the third year in a row here at UT. Three years ago we became the first chapter to ever win all three awards. The Trifecta consists of Academics, Campus and Community Involvement, and Sports. This past year we held a 3.35 GPA as a chapter, had over 140 community service hours per member, and won intramural championships in dodgeball, softball, soccer and more. At Songfest we had Senior, Daniel Janisz, named as Greek man of the Year, along with four members tapped in Blue Key National Honor Society, which recognizes the top 13 leaders along campus. We also had numerous other brothers selected into Mortar Board National Honor Society and Order of Omega Honor Society. There are currently over twenty organizations in which a SigEp serves as the president including Blue Key, Mortar Board, Order of Omega, and Presidential Ambassadors.

We started the fall semester off strong with recruitment through the Balanced Man Scholarship Banquet. After reviewing over 200 applications we were able to award \$5,000 to ten outstanding incoming freshmen. We also held our annual SigEp Slip N' Slide where we built a 200 foot long Slip N' Slide down Parks Tower Hill during opening weekend. We had our biggest attendance yet with over 900 participants. Through all our recruitment efforts we were able to sign a very ambitious class of 34 members, bringing our roster to over 100 men.

Over the summer we were very fortunate to have our kitchen updated. The total project cost around \$27,000 that wouldn't have been made possible without the generosity of our alumni. The kitchen renovation included new cabinets that include a trophy case, counter tops, sink, and tile flooring. We also received new couches for the first floor. The house now looks fantastic and as a chapter we owe a great deal of gratitude to the Alumni Board for their continued support to keep our house the best on campus.

As a chapter, we couldn't be happier with how the past year has turned out. We now look to a young and ambitious executive board to work side by side with me. The executive board for 2015 will be: Tyler Hotchkiss, Vice President of Programming; Alec Falkenberg, Vice President of Finance; Todd Klewer, Vice President of Member Development; Kyle Boyers, Vice President of Recruitment; Lucas Zastrow, Chaplain; Aaron DeGuilio, Vice President of Operations; Evan Westlake, Vice President of Communications; and Mahmoud Awad, House Manager.
