Alumni President's Report 1986... A Year of Growth, A Push To The Future!!

As we close our 6th year as the Toledo Area Sigma Phi Epsilon Alumni Association, let me take this moment to reflect upon our past, examine our growth, and aspire to the future!!

In 1901, 12 young men gathered in a quiet room on the 3rd floor of Ryland Hall to form a bond that would last a lifetime. They came to create a new beginning, a new era, one that would provide all of us with a common bond...that called "Brotherhood"

Each came with their own ideas and dreams, that, combined, would provide a foundation of spiritual hope and lasting friendship. Each of us has our own definition of this bond, but no one can deny the basis of this foundation, "Virtue", "Diligence", and "Brotherly Love".

Since then, Sigma Phi Epsilon has grown to 255 chapters nationwide, with 155,485 intitiates. Locally, Ohio lota has initiated 902 brothers since 1950, averaging 25 per year. We have had the strongest little sister organization on campus, and many of us have married these dynamic women. Our Alumni membership continues to prosper, as indicated by this past years record membership of 84 members. Never before have we seen the support of Brotherhood so strong! Our Educational Foundation, started in 1983, is now endowed by the University of Toledo Alumni corporation, with over \$6,000.00 in contributions over the past 3 years.

The undergraduate chapter has grown to over 100 members, and is by far the strongest and most stable organization on the total university campus. By 1988, our mortgage will be paid off on the House, proving that 15 years of hard work and commitments of the Brothers in 1974 have not gone unnoticed. One cannot deny that these statistics are impressive, and it is more than ample proof that Sigma Phi Epsilon is Alive & Well!

But what about the future? What dreams and goals still lie ahead? What new horizons can be crossed? The questions are many, the answers few. Sigma Phi Epsilon is forever changing, constantly obtaining new heights, creating and accomplishing new goals. Yes, Sigma Phi Epsilon is Alive and Growing, ready to meet tomorrow's fraternal needs. But one must remember that Brotherhood is more than just a bond that we all share, but it is a commitment for life! It is a tribute to our college years, those years that have played such an important part in our past.
