Bill Dunwoodie (A & S '85), past undergraduate president, headed up the selection committee, which consisted of James Schalitz (Eng. '84); President of the Educational Foundation, Randy McCullough (Bus. '81), James Irmen (Bus. '81), and Timothy Croak (A & S '82).

"We are extremely proud to give this award to two very qualified candidates," remarked Schalitz.

"The quality of the applicants was extremely high. It speaks well of the undergraduates to have such members in the chapter. Choosing just two was extremely difficult. We wish we could have awarded more.'

The awards are in the form of loans, to be paid back upon graduation and a good financial start of the recipients. 'We felt that given the size of the loans, the recipients should be able to pay them back when they are settled as an alumni. Hopefully with some interest in the form of a contribution." commented Jim Irmen, Foundation Member. "If that became a reality, we could double our awards every four years.'

Over the summer the Educational Foundation will be gearing up for the next fund raising drive. By Homecoming '85, many alumni will be contacted.

Brother Schalitz concluded with these thoughts. "On behalf of the Educational Foundation, I would like to thank the many alumni who made this initial award a reality from a dream in just one short year. With your help, we have helped to make an impact upon the future."

Campus Notes

Dr. James D. McComas, 56, president of Mississippi State University, will become the 12th president of The University of Toledo in early July. The appointment culminates a 13 month national search which was begun when President Glen R. Driscoll announced his plans to retire June 30. The announcement of Dr. McComas as Dr. Driscoll's successor was made April 2 by Warren Buckey, chairman of the U.T. Board of Trustees.

----A record \$58,972 for student scholarships was raised during the 23rd annual Alumni Phonathon held Feb. 3-7. Jerry Updegraff, U.T. director of development, said the amount is 70% more than last years total of \$34,843.

----A companion Mailathon was held for alumni living outside the Toledo area. All proceeds are used for fund scholarships administered by the Alumni Foundation or to meet other University needs. Last year, approximately \$1.7 million was contributed to U.T. for scholarships, according to Mr. Updegraff.

----The University Beautification Committee is planning to build a monument to U.T. students and alumni killed or missing in action during the Korean or Vietnam conflicts. If you know of someone who was killed or missing in action during either conflict, please send as much information as possible, such as the person's name, years attended U.T., home town, major and college, to Dr. Merrit Obreiter, Beautification
