How About...Mark Mandula pledges Sig Ep! es, Sig Ep at the University of Toledo was about to undergo a big change....the Mandula's. Starting in 1975, and finishing in the late 1980's, the Sig Ep chapter grew exponentially, both in size and quality. And the Mandula's continued to join in mass! Mark Mandula '75 eventually became Sig Ep President in 1978. Following right behind him, was Jack Mandula (76), who served as our President until 1980. After that, Tom '78 and David '82 joined the chapter, and served in numerous leadership roles throughout their tenure at the University of Toledo. Jack ran for Student Government President, remember......Mandula Brown?

Margaret Mandula, (their Mother), was a Sweetheart of the fraternity! John Mandula, their father, was the driving force encouraging all Sig Ep brothers to continue their education, and to be involved in the future of the University.

John Mandula passed away May 10th, 2003, in Palm Harbor, FL, where Margaret and John moved in the late 90's. Born in Stropkov, Czechoslovakia, he resided in Palm Harbor since 1998, after moving from Toledo, Ohio. He retired in 1986, as a Buyer and Merchandising Executive, working for R. H. Macy's, LaSalles Department Store and Elder-Beerman for over 30 years. He was a World War II Veteran, having served as a Motor Machinist, Third Class in the United States Coast Guard. He was a member of the Espiritu Santo Catholic Church, and the Knights of Columbus, Barney Gonyea Council 7109

John left us all with wonderful memories, and a tribute to our fraternity, the gift of brotherhood. John was a wonderful person, a loving husband and father, and a devoted supporter of the University of Toledo, and the Fraternity. John never complained of his illness, and always had a positive attitude about life. His life revolved around his family and friends, and he challenged each of us to make life better for someone else. Complaining never helps, its positive attitude that will get you through!

As a tribute, the Mandula family created the Sigma Phi Epsilon Margaret and John Mandula Fund at the University of Toledo. The scholarship is known as the John and Margaret Mandula Challenge Scholarship, and is awarded to an Undergraduate Sigma Phi Epsilon Brother whom has undergone a hardship in his life, and has been successful at achieving a resolution that has made him better today.

Since November of 2003, the Mandula Family and Friends donated over \$12,000 to the fund, which was matched dollar for dollar by the family. Today, the fund balance has reached record levels for a new scholarship fund at UT, and shall provide the necessary endowment to perpetuate the scholarship for a lifetime.

News from the Alumni & Volunteer Board

he University of Toledo created a new award a few years ago that rated all of the student organizations on the campus – nearly 800 of them. Well, on April 26, Ohio Iota Chapter of Sigma Phi Epsilon was named the Outstanding Student Organization at UT. This is the first time a sorority or fraternity has won the award and it just goes along with all of the other honors that came to Sig Ep this year.

We started with a Buchanan Cup in San Antonio last summer – the fifth for this chapter. Then we scored 97% on the Greek Evaluation higher than any other fraternity, placed 1st in Scholarship for Dean Parks Trophy, 1st in Sports, and 3rd in Campus and Community. We took 3rd in Songfest, had 6 men elected to Blue Key, including Jon Hassel, president, Ross Altenburger, treasurer, Allen Bresson, Tom Crawford, Gordon Pokorny, and Devon Scheible. Guy Beeman won the Blue Key Schmakel Scholarship. The Mortar Board found 6 men from Sig Ep on board there also, including Crawford, president, Scheible, secretary, Altenburger, Hassel, Pokorny, and Alex Sturgill. Nikko Ronquillo was named one of the recipients of the Mortar Board Underclassmen Award. Guy Beeman was again elected Student Body President and Donovan Nichols continues as a governor's appointment to the University Board of Trustees.

In the National Fraternity category, Steve Studer won the Ruck Campus Leadership Award at this year's CLA, and the chapter brought home a Dean's Cup for highest grades on campus. The 78 men have a cumulative grade point average of 3.3 – the highest of any Greek letter organization. Ryan Schmidt was named the Zollinger Senior for District 12, and two men were selected for the very competitive Ruck Leadership Institute at Williamsburg, VA – Allen Bresson and Rich Miller. Sunny Gupta won a national improvement scholarship and two men will travel to UIFI Leadership School at Purdue this summer – Jon Hassel and Jeremy Maple.

At the Senior Alumni Dinner in April, Ohio Iota recognized two exceptional alumni. Brian Paskvan '84, Assistant to the President and Acting Dean of the Findlay Campus of Owens College was awarded the Volunteer Excellence Award for his many contributions to the chapter over the years, including board service and chapter counselor. The Career Achievement Award went to Les Lipski '73, currently chief financial officer for Norton Manufacturing Company.

The Alumni Board is still looking for additional members to work with the board and the chapter. We will be finalizing our 5-year Strategic Plan in June. Our goals align with the undergraduate plans, so that we can continue to be the pre-eminent fraternity on the UT campus and provide the finest undergraduate fraternity experience possible. One of the goals we will be trying to implement will be to establish a fund so that we can help finance training opportunities for these exceptional young leaders. Opportunities such as Ruck, UIFI, Sig Ep's ultimate training the Trip to Greece, CLA's and Conclaves are all expensive on an undergraduate budget. We hope to establish a fund of at least \$20,000 so that we can utilize the interest to award deserving undergraduates the opportunities to excel.
