

Fifth annual Raft Regatta set for May 19th

Once again the Sig Ep-Stroh's Great Raft Regatta will conclude Spring Week activities on the University of Toledo campus.

Activities sponsored by different organozations will begin Monday, May 14 and conclude on Friday, May 19 with the ever growing regatta, which is in it's fifth year.

The regatta consists of rafts built by the entrants which race down the Ottawa Creek that flows beside the Carlson Library.

The raft must be no larger than four feet wide and six feet long. The rafts are constructed from a variety of materials, from conventional inner tubes to molded styrofoam. Any organization on campus can enter in the race. In the early heats, time trials will eliminate some contestants. In the semi-final and final heats, head-on raft vs. raft competition will decide the winner.

"Plans have been moving along good, slowly, and surely, but we hope to make it the biggest and best ever, it being the 5th annual," said Jeff Sopko, organizer of the regatta. Over fourty rafts are expected to compete for the first place spot, making this the largest field ever in the five year

history of the regatta. More than 500 fans, friends, and frolickers are expected to line the river banks.

"Since this is the fifth annual, I would like to thank the original raft regatta planners; Bruce Williams, Bob Ruckman, Don Warnke, and Dr. Larry Marzulli; Also raftmen Jay Sopko and Jesse Capri. I would like to thank them for their originality, foresite and hard work to make this an annual spring tradition," Sopko added about the history of the regatta. He also stressed that all Alumni are invited and encouraged to attend the regatta.

No hazing for new pledges

For years the Sigma Phi Epsilon National Headquarters has been urging the indivuidal chapters to adopt a pledge program free of any sort of hazing. Ohio Iota, while not being the first chapter to follow the advice of National, is certainly not the last.

The brothers voted overwhelmingly last October to adopt a modern and progressive pledge program beginning with the Fall 1978 pledge class. The new program was not thrown together haphazardly, but through much research into other chapters new programs, material from National and most importantly the advice and opinions from brothers of Ohio Iota. A special retreat was held in the summer to formalize the teachings of the new program.

Gone from the new pledge program are organized line-ups and individual hazing of any pledge. Emphasis is placed on a one-to-one relationship between brothers and pledges, with the thought that the pledge is not "the lowest creature on the earth," but an equal. The pledges are still required to learn their material and to show respect for our traditions, the house and one another. However, it is no longer "beat" into them, but rather pressure is applied while allowing the pledges to move at their own pace in accomplishing their objectives within their nine weeks of pledgeship.

I am sure there are alumni, as there are active brothers, who insist a good pledge program is not possible without hazing, and that the fraternity's atmosphere is turning into that of a country club. These views are understandable when there has been no viable alternative used. We have now used the alternative—and it works. We experienced problems Fall quarter and still are,

but we have been able to realize these shortcomings and are attempting to correct them.

We still have a lot of progress to make in order to bring out pledging program to a point where it is completely free of hazing, but that will come with time and the general maturing of the brotherhood toward that end. For now much progress has been made with the basis laid for future change (this was recognized by National at the Regional Academy held at Cleveland State where Ohio Iota won an Excelsior Cup for the new brotherhood development program.)
