

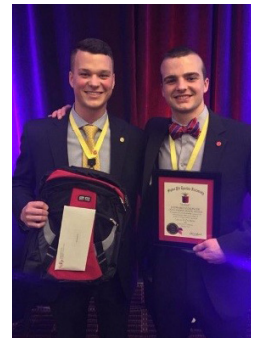

Alumni President's Message



VIRTUE!

Would the Brothers of Chi Beta Chi believe where we are today? Founded in 1928, I am uncertain if I will be here for our 100th Anniversary, but many will be, and I am sure the reason we will get together will be for the utmost reason...Virtue!

Could Judge John Potter have known that the Fraternity he joined in the 1930s would become such a great example of Fraternity Life at Toledo, and once again, be recognized as one of SigEp's top chapters nationwide?

Many of our Chi Beta Brothers are no longer with us, and those that remain are simply amazed at where Sig Ep is today. Why? Because they had many of the same issues that we experience today: 1) Character – the values we instill in our members; 2) Culture – helping our community and university; and last, 3) Brotherhood, for without this concept, we would be just another club on UT's campus.

Recently, Donovan Nichols, Ohio Iota '03, gave me a small booklet, in excellent condition, that talked about the way Chi Beta Chi was holding a dance. They had representatives from all of the other Greek organizations invited. Culture? You Bet! And that's where I found Judge Potter's name. Do a little research, and you will find a lot of information on him; about what inspired him, what he saw in Chi Beta Chi, and how he used that small fraternity to launch a virtuous and honorable career.

My point is simple. When we continuously do our best, our best will become the norm, and the norm will become even higher, which in turn will require setting new goals to achieve. So, this year, we took a different look at the Senior Alumni Dinner. Why not celebrate our rebirth as Sigma Phi Epsilon, and show why the watch words of Chi Beta Chi were so important in our history?

Since 2000, we have initiated over 600 brothers into the ranks SigEp. 1140 is the pin number of Brent Denny. Over 100 Chi Beta Chi members chose to become brothers of Sigma Phi Epsilon on September 30, 1950. It took 50 years to reach Pin #1140. That's an average of 20 men joining SigEp each year until the year 2000. Since 2000, an average of 40 men per year have joined SigEp. Why? There are many reasons why the number of men joining SigEp has doubled!

As I write this article, SigEp has the highest GPA of any group on campus and boasts a total of 130 members. SigEp is first in grades, first in sports, and is no doubt the most active organization, fraternity or otherwise, on campus. We have leaders everywhere! The member development program replaced hazing and the pledge model, and if the average number of men joining Ohio Iota has doubled, how can anyone debate the change and success of the program?

A few weeks ago, I had lunch with a brother from my era that I had not seen since graduation. It amazed me how he had really changed his life, and truly adopted his own version of the "Balanced Man." He decided that his life in the future would change the lives of many young men after him. It is an amazing story, but what I focused on was his passion, and how he truly adopted everything we represent today...most importantly, virtue.

Many of our brothers, since 2000, have adopted his philosophy. I can think of so many great examples of extraordinary brothers over the past 15 years, that it would be impossible to list. Brothers like Matt Hagemeyer, Adam Scharf, Eric Croak, Chris Lehman, Ryan Schmidt...I can go on and on. The quality of our brothers is through the roof! And they have followed some great examples, in brothers like Les Lipski, Tim Croak, Jack Mandula, Russ Karbin, Dan Nowak...all living noble and incredible lives!

But no other Brother can top this list like Brother Mark Mandula has! I want to take a moment to say thank you to Brother Mark Mandula. He has been the best cheerleader I ever could ask for, and with his generous gift, he sent 30 young men to Conclave in Nashville, TN.

That, my brothers, is virtue at its finest!
