Alan went on to have a 31-year career in Sylvania schools teaching junior high World and American History.

In 1985 he took a year's sabbatical from teaching to travel around the world on his bicycle, peddling almost 10,000 miles. Even more, in 2005, he traveled 4,000 miles on the Lewis and Clark Trail from St. Louis to Astoria, Oregon, to gather background for a reenactment program while raising funds for the Alzheimer's Association, American Cancer Society, and Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation.
