Recipient of the University of Toledo Sig Ep Founder's Circle Award. Robert grew up north of New York City, and applied to the Engineering School at the University of Toledo in 1956. He moved on campus, living in Dowd Hall. In 1958, he decided to join Sigma Phi Epsilon, and never looked back. His new member class had 10 members, including Charles Walters and Bruce Kuntz.



Robert graduated in 1961, with a Bachelors Degree in Chemical Engineering. He worked at Dupont in the paint division, and decided to get a law degree from Toledo and graduated in 1966. Sigma Phi Epsilon Scholarship Report Spotlight on President's Club Scholarship

he full name of this fund is the Sigma Phi Epsilon Presidents Club Scholarship – In Memory of Robert Gates (Fund 1302113). The charitable focus of the fund is to promote academics, living in the house, and leadership in the local chapter. It was created and championed in 2013 by Brother Ted Behnken to honor Robert Gates, our founding president at Ohio Iota. He was at the helm of our local chapter as we transitioned to the national organization of Sigma Phi Epsilon in 1950. The fund

was christened at our Senior/Alumni Dinner in April of 2013 by Janet Gates, Robert's daughter, and also by Larry Leake, 1952 President and friend of Robert Gates. Janet was able to recount some biographical information about her father, Bob. He was born in New Jersey in 1927, but wound up in Toledo graduating from DeVilbiss HS where he met his longtime wife, Carol. He served in the Army Air Corps before attending UT to earn an engineering degree. Bob joined XBX local fraternity, the predecessor of Sig Ep, and at a time when many local fraternities were transitioning to national fraternities, he led the chapter through the decision process to choose Sigma Phi Epsilon...a choice that has stood the test of time. After college, he served Alcoa for 43 years as a successful executive. In Janet's words, "He was a family man who, with his wife Carol, exemplified all of the characteristics of the Greatest Generation."

It is notable that Ted endeavored to "prime" the fund by reaching out to past presidents to be the first to give. And in yet another act of Sig Ep leadership, the past presidents stepped up to push the fund's balance past its endowed mark in the first year. The fund is now our third largest fund with an endowed balance surpassing \$65,000 and yielding over \$2000 per year in scholarships.

One of the interesting things I found in researching this topic was the list of past presidents contacted to help kick start the fund. Croak. My guess is that if you're reading this article, you'll recognize a past president in this list.

Our President's Club fund continues to grow with its roots in Bob's leadership along with the many presidents that followed him.
